APM/19/03/02 Chairman's Report

Thanks to the hard work of our Clerk the Parish Council secured a third lottery grant for play equipment which has now been installed in the play area. This equipment is intended for the smaller members of our community as requested by residents.

The hedge on Boundary Walk at the side of the Play Area has been vandalised. The reason for this is not known. If anyone has any information then the Parish Council would like to hear from you.

As part of Lincolnshire County Council winter self-help initiative, a grit bin has been placed at the entrance to the estate on Jubilee Avenue. The grit is for use on the public paths.

Speed limits have been a constant concern for the Parish Council and there have been many surveys carried out in the village. Times have moved on from the days of people in hi viz coats pointing a speed gun at traffic. Whilst this acted as a deterrent at the time it was in operation it did not give an overall picture. Black box's are now strapped to an appropriate pole and constantly measure the speed of vehicles. One such box has been in operation on the A46 by Jubilee Avenue to monitor the traffic.

The Parish Council has recently received a complaint regarding a child playing football on the playing field and slipping over on dog mess which resulted in them getting it on their clothes. There is a sign at the entrance to the playing field which clearly states no dogs. The Parish Council has not given anyone permission to take a dog on the playing field.
